

HANNE VAN DER WOUDE EMMY'S WORLD

Hanne van der Woude

Hanne van der Woude, was born in 1982 in Nijmegen, Holland. She studied at the Kunsthochschule ArtEZ in Arnhem from 1999–2002 and graduated with photography. Today she lives and works as a photographer in Arnhem. Long-term projects are characteristic for her artistic work. She becomes extensively, and, at the same time, carefully involved in the people's lives that she portrays. She observes, empathises, looks for and wins their trust. Her attention is focused on the charisma of the people she portrays; their behavior, their emotions, their individual aesthetic. Hanne van der Woude applied this method of working to her first big project, **"MC1R Natural Red Hair"**. In 2008, her photographs of people with red hair brought her international recognition, first with a solo exhibition at The Hague Museum of Photography in Den Haag, later as a new, young talent in the „Europe Night“ at the renowned photo festival "Rencontres d'Arles". In the meantime, Hanne van der Woude's works have been shown in numerous international museums, including the Musée de l'Elysee, Museum for Photography, Lausanne (2008) and in the Kiyosato Museum of Photographic Arts in Yamanashi, Japan (2010). **EMMY'S WORLD** was shown for the first time in the Huis Marseille, Museum for Photography in Amsterdam. Beginning on 24 September 2016, **EMMY'S WORLD** will be Hanne van der Woude's first solo exhibition in Germany.

Emmy Eerdmans und Ben Joosten

Emmy (Emerentiana) Eerdmans was born in 1931 in the Dutch town of Bussum. She started taking classes at an early age with artists such as Jan van Tongeren, Jan Wiegers and Cor Hund and studied, beginning in 1960, at the "Nationaal Hoger Instituut voor de Schone Kunsten" in Antwerp. By 1957, Emmy Eerdmans had already received the renowned Prix de Rome for portrait painting. In 1963, she married the graphic designer, Ben Joosten. He ran a bronze foundry together with one of his brothers; Emmy encouraged him to also work artistically. Both were interested in the world and travelled together to Zimbabwe. They were delighted with the art scene they found there and were inspired to create a variety of works of art. Since 1974, Eerdmans and Joosten have lived in a former school in Dodewaard in the region of Betuwe. Ben Joosten died in 2013. His brother Egbert died shortly before that, and after many years of seclusion in the south of France, he spent the last year of his life living with Emmy and Ben in Dodewaard. Herman, the brother who joined the group in the first trip to France and who is also part of the photo project, is still alive.

In the Netherlands, the artistic work of Emmy Eerdmans provided a close connection to the royal family: Eerdmans had portrayed the children of Queen Beatrix and for her 80th birthday, the queen congratulated Eerdmans by telegram.
